

REGULATIONS SEAOTTER EUROPE – LA TRAMUN - GIRONA

1. DATE

21 SEPTEMBER Girona (Girona)

2. START

Les Planes d'Hostoles, Girona at 9:30

3. FEATURES OF THE TRAMUN – GIRONA

The Tramun is a classic mountain bike race. The race attracts both individual competitors and members of sporting associations. Participants must use a mountain bike and the wearing of a helmet is compulsory.

Participation with an e-bike is not allowed.

4. RACE COURSE

The race is defined in two words: tough and captivating. The Tramun Sea Otter Europe offers a spectacular route, marked by the enormous number of trails it crosses. The trails become the main protagonists during the 82 km and 2.969 HM; a test that tests the physical conditions and technical skills of the runners.

5. PARTICIPATION

Participants in this category must have the UCI license, processed by the corresponding Federation. The minimum age to participate in this category must be 19 years old the year of the race.

The Marathon World Cup falls under the current regulations of the technical commission of the Catalan Cycling Federation (FCC by its Catalan abbreviation) and UCI.

6. REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT: Registration is exclusively managed through the Datasport online portal dedicated to the 2025 HERO UCI Cross-country Marathon World Cup. Registrations through the official portals of individual races will not be accepted. Entries are not valid and final until all fees have been paid in full.

The participation fee is € 150,00 for all World Cup competitors. **Registrations close on 12th September, on the Friday at 13:00 (01:00 pm) CET. Late registrations are not accepted.**

Start blocks for each race will be determined based on the UCI ranking. With the approval of the race director and jury members, UCI delegates may adjust the starting order.

TRANSFERS: The Rider acknowledges that Event entry is personal to them and that entries cannot be transferred, assigned, gifted, sold or deferred.

WITHDRAWAL: If a Rider elects to withdraw from the competition, they must inform HERO at the following email address: registration@heroucimarathonworldcup.com

REFUNDS: Entry fee insurance can be purchased during the registration process. Upon presentation of a valid certificate, the insurance will issue a voucher for the corresponding amount. For information and submission of the documents, please contact schaden@erv.ch. To receive a refund of the registration fee, the voucher number must be sent along with banking details to info@datasport.com. (A 5,00 € administration fee will be deducted)

7. DOCUMENT CHECK AND RACE NUMBER COLLECTION

- Collection of start numbers will take place at Fontajau Pavillion:

- Elite Rider Registration at Les Planes d'Hostoles:
SUNDAY 21, 8:00-9:00 Bib collection

8. STARTING ORDER

Starting time from 9:30 am.

9. CATEGORIES

- **Women:** Elite, Master
- **Men:** Elite, Master

10. CONTROLS

The mechanical controls at the start and along the two race routes are obligatory. Any biker who sets off prior or without taking the necessary control on the start line will be regarded as not having set off and so no reference will be made to him or her in the final race classification.

11. CLASSIFICATION

All bikers will be referred to in the classifications. The classifications will be prepared regarding times and not with regards to order of arrival.

12. RESULTS AND PRIZEGIVING

The start lists and the results will also be available on internet at www.heroucimarathonworldcup.com.

The official prize ceremony of the La Tramun race will take place at 3 pm at the finish area. The Final HERO UCI Marathon World Cup prizegiving ceremony will take place at 03:15 pm.

The presence of the top three finishers in each category is mandatory at the prizegiving ceremony. Race prizes (cash and in nature) will only be awarded and handed over to athletes who are present.

13. PRIZES

Prizes for individual races will be awarded in accordance with UCI regulations and issued via bank transfer.

Race prizes (cash and in nature) will only be awarded and handed over to athletes who are present. Winners of cash prizes for each stage must submit a request using the official cash prize request form.

14. CLOTHING AND ADVERTISING

Overall leaders for both men and women must wear the jersey provided by the organization. The jersey has a space at the disposal of the competitor reserved for the advertising of their main sponsor.

In all formal award ceremonies, participating competitors must get on the podium wearing their team's jersey and shorts.

15. VEHICLE MECHANICAL ASSISTANCE

Any support by non-officials during the course of the races is severely prohibited and will result in disqualification, except places defined by the O.K.-Team.

16. TEAM AREA

The space in the Team Area is primarily reserved for UCI MTB Teams accredited through the UCI. Requests for space for UCI teams must be sent 30 days prior to the race to alexandra.ploner@heroucimarathonworldcup.com.

17. PRESS CONFERENCE

At each round of the HERO UCI Marathon World Cup, a press meeting with Elite athletes. The Press Conference at the La Tramun is scheduled on 21 September at 04:00 pm (after the official prizegiving ceremonies) at the Fontajau Pavillion – Sea Otter Europe event venue.

At the request of the organiser, the three best placed riders/winners of the 2025 HERO UCI Marathon World Cup standings must attend the press conference.

18. SPORT AND NATURE

Our sport is an activity for both competition and leisure that takes place in the nature. Its impact on the environment is the responsibility of all participants and organizers of the sport events.

The participants are asked not to drop litter along the route to in respect the environment such as the animals.

19. IMAGE RIGHTS

All participants cede their image rights to the organization, being able to use any photograph or video where they appear, for promotional purposes of the Organizer.

20. EVENT CANCELLATION

The Organising Committee reserves the right to make changes to the regulations, to the course and race conditions itself.

The event will take place irrespective of weather conditions provided that there is no risk to the health or safety of the participants. The Organising Committee retains the right to interrupt or cancel the race.

Should the race be cancelled for circumstances beyond the control of the Organisers or for Acts

of God, the entry fee will not be refunded nor used for the following year's fee. All details with regard to such circumstances will be published on the internet or in loco during the race itself.

21. RIGHT AND OBLIGATIONS OF PARTICIPANTS

The number and the chip, provided by the Organisation, has to be fixed to the handlebars and on the back of the participant in a clearly visible manner. The number cannot be modified or changed in any way. Bikers must wear a hard safety approved helmet which must be kept fastened throughout the race. Road safety regulations must be respected throughout. Furthermore, all are required to keep with them an ID throughout the whole race. Bikers are required to move aside to allow faster bikers to overtake. Extreme prudence is to be exercised in parts of the race with poor visibility.

Any stop for repairs must be made in a clearly visible area away from the main race route. Participants who quit the race have to give such communication to the Organisation and hand the number back to the next security controller along the route. No change of lane is allowed in the final approach to the finishing line and a violation of this stipulation will lead to the biker being disqualified.

22. DISQUALIFICATION

Any biker found to be taking part with the race number of another, to have passed one's race number to another, to have started from a grid proceeding that assigned, or guilty of other serious offence as determined by the Organisation Committee will be immediately excluded from the event and any position in race classification will be cancelled.

Bikers are reminded of their duty not to throw litter on the course route and to make use of the green zone at the beginning and end of each refreshment point. Bikers throwing litter on the ground and not making use of the services provided will be disqualified.

It is severely prohibited to use any form of electric or electronic support on the bike itself and any biker found to have done so, will be disqualified or removed from the final race classification. Tandems are not allowed.

23. RESPONSIBILITY

All participants in the Tramun participate at their own risk.

The enrolment, even if done by a third party on one's behalf, infers and provides that the participant accepts to waive any right, direct, or of third parties, against the Organising Committee and all individuals or organisations involved in the event. Furthermore, by enrolling in the event the participant declares to be sufficiently in form to face the challenge required to complete the race.

24. ACCEPTANCE OF THE REGULATIONS

The registration for any of the events implies the acceptance and respect of the rules pertaining to each one of the races for which the participant has registered.



APPEALS: Any appeal or protest should be addressed to the race jury in the measure pretended in the regulations and should be accompanied by the fee as fixed by the FCC and UCI regulation.

VARIATIONS: The Organising Committee reserves the right at any moment and in any circumstance to make changes to the regulations. Internet is the official medium for event information and as such all official event communications will be found there.
